WELCOME IN BESAC!

Thank you for choosing ISBA Besançon for your international mobility!

This practical guide will help you prepare your arrival and facilitate your first days in Besançon.

BESANCON - FIRST TIME HERE?

Besançon is situated in the region of Franche-Comté, in the East of France, close enough to the Swiss border.

The city has a population of 118000+ people.

Residents are called "Bisontins" and "Bisontines".



Since 1986, Besancon has been known as "the city of art and history" due to its rich historical and cultural heritage.

Since 2008, the fortifications built by military engineer Vauban figure on the **UNESCO World heritage list**.

CLIMATE - ...IS RAIN A THING HERE?

The city of Besancon is subject to a double climate effect:

- an oceanic climate: significant & frequent rainfall;
- a strong continental effect with
 - o hard winters (heavy frost, snow)
 - o warm, dry summers

You will need warm clothes and shoes in winter (October to April) and light clothes in summer.

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BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

Before arriving in France and Besancon, You have to make sure that you have your **Erasmus+** /other scholarship sorted and have contacted the CROUS (regional organization for student support) to secure a student accommodation.

At the end of this chapter, you will find a little **checklist** that summarizes what you need to have ready before leaving.

SOCIAL AND MEDICAL COVER

If you're an EU-citizen, you can benefit from the **European Health Insurance Card** (CEAM in French).

It will grant you rights to health insurance and medical care according to the laws and procedures in force in our country.

Do not forget to submit your request to your Health Insurance Fund at least 15 days before your departure.

Please note: this card is individual and personal. Each family member should have their own, including children under 16 years.

With this card, you won't need to include any health insurance document in your application.

HOUSING - YOUR OPTIONS AS A STUDENT

Accommodation in CROUS Residences:

ISBA signed an agreement with the CROUS to ensure that every foreign student enrolled in the Erasmus+ program gets access to a renovated room in a university residence.

Before your arrival, ISBA will contact you to ask you if you want to benefit from this partnership and live at CROUS.

Résidence Colette (on Campus):




15min walk from ISBA

20min from the city by bus

- **9m² room** = €250/month
- **50m² 2-room** = €600/month

Résidence Canot (in the center):



Near the CLA (French learning center)

- 11m² room = €260/month - 15m² room = €290/month

Résidence <u>Mégevand</u> (<u>further</u> in the center):

- 20m² room = €300 - 30m² room = €420

Washing machines and dryers are generally available in the student residences of the CROUS.

If you do not have a washing machine in your accommodation, you can use a self-service laundromat.

Documents to provide:

Whatever your situation, as a tenant, you must:

\square Fill out a standard lease and make an inventory of		
fixtures at the reception		
☐ Pay a deposit (1 month of the rent) at your arrival. It		
will be given back to you at your departure if no damage		
was observed		
☐ Provide a certificate of insurance for fire, water		
damage and civil liability.		

Housing Assistance (CAF):

As a tenant, you may benefit from government grants such as:

- ALS (social housing allowance)
- APL (individual housing)

The grant amount is calculated according to your resources.

COMING TO BESANÇON - BOOK YOUR TICKETS!

BY PLANE:

Several airports can get you closer to Besançon:

- Paris airports Charles de Gaulle & Orly
- Lyon Saint-Exupéry Airport
- EuroAirport Basel-Mulhouse
- Geneva Airport

GOOD TO KNOW: Dole (DLE) is the closest airport, but it only covers a couple of European and Mediterranean destinations.

From these airports, shuttles and trains are available to get to Besançon.

BY TRAIN:

While booking your train tickets to Besançon, you may come across two main stations:

- "Besançon-Viotte" is the main city station, close enough to the centre.
- "Besançon Franche-Comté TGV", the high-speed train station, is 20km from Besançon.

To get to Besançon-Viotte, you can then book a TER (Express regional train) on ${\tt sncf-connect.com}$

(TIP: get the app!)

Estimation for a one-way trip for under-29 individuals without a discount card:

Paris-Besançon	€40-50
Lyon-Besançon	€40-50
Mulhouse-Besançon	€30
Genève-Besançon	€60-80

GETTING AROUND IN BESAC - FROM (A) TO (B)

Getting your student bus/tram card:

If you are staying in Besançon for a semester+, you should really consider subscribing to a bus/tram monthly pass:


Pricing: 1 reload card (€4) + 1 student monthly pass: €16.80

Total: €20.80

Everything can be done online at ginko.voyage/boutique, you will need to provide:

☐ ID card			
☐ Identity photo			
☐ School certificat			
☐ RIB/bank details	if you're	paying through	transfers)

You can then choose to have it delivered within 7 days or pick it up the next day at GINKO's office.

Using your credit card as a pass:

If you have yet to subscribe to a pass or if you forgot to reload your pass, you can always use your credit card to get on the bus/tram.

It works as a 1-hour ticket:

- You must validate it each time you get on a bus/tram
- It costs €1.40 and gives you unlimited travel for 1 hour

Bus/tram lines you'll get familiar with:

- Tram lines T1/T2 pass by the train station, the city center and the hospital.
- Bus line 3 is the main bus line, it passes by the train station, intermarché (supermarket), the city-center and Campus.

- Bus lines 7 and 9 have a stop right in front of ISBA, named "Beaux-Arts" = Fine Arts
- Bus line 4 goes to the shopping area "Chateaufarine"

CYCLING:

Cycling is the cheapest and often times the fastest way to get around the city.

GOOD TO KNOW - The student Association "Vélocampus" provides a bike repair workshop on Campus.

The "V'elocit'e" service offers self-service bicycles to move around and in the city center. Annual subscription is $\mathbf{\in}16$.

WALKING:

Besançon is a human-scale city. It takes around 20 minutes to cross the historical city-center "la Boucle".

Going to the city center from the campus will take around 40 minutes.

COMMUNICATIONS – STAYING IN TOUCH

Using the phone:

To call abroad from France, you have to dial:

+ [code of the country] [phone number of your caller]

Example for a German number: +49 xxx xxxxxxx

Global prepaid cards:

They allow you to call abroad at an attractive price. It is possible to use these cards from a street phone or a landline. You can buy them at a tobacco/newspaper store.

Mobile phone:

In France, there are several telephone operators: Orange, SFR, Free, Bouygues Télécom, La Poste, etc.

You can choose an annual subscription or a prepaid card (in this case you will need a mobile phone).

The cost of a subscription is between €2 and €60 per month. We advise you to choose a suitable contract based on your use during your stay. Be careful about the period of subscription and the terms of the contract.

Internet and Wi-Fi:

There are several Wi-Fi connectors with free access in Besançon. Most of the buildings of the University have free Wi-Fi. Some fast-food restaurants in public places (CRIJ, train station, malls) also offer free access to Wi-Fi.

Internet subscription:

To get an internet connection at home, you have to sign up with an operator (the same as for your mobile).

Your accommodation must be connected to the phone or optical fiber network. The cost of a subscription is generally between $\in 10$ and $\in 30$.

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT IN FRANCE

Students have to open a bank account in their name for several reasons:

- To receive housing assistance
- To receive reimbursements from the social security and mutual
- To pay their rent
- To pay their bills (electricity, water)
- For different shopping purchases

How to open a bank account?

Made an appointment with the bank of your choice and go to the bank with the following documents:

- Your ID/passport
- Your VISA/residency permit (for non EU-citizens)
- Proof of address: rent receipt, electricity bill...

Managing a current account:

You will benefit from several means of payment: credit card and a cheque book.

If your credit card and/or cheque book get lost or stolen, contact your bank immediately with your contract info to cancel them.



AFTER YOUR ARRIVAL

EATING - STUDENTS RESTAURANTS & CAFETERIAS



University restaurant:

University restaurants of CROUS are often called "Resto U" or "RU". It is the best way to get cheap, complete and balanced meals daily.

The RU offers several options so that each student can meet their dietary requirements.

Cost for a meal at the RU = $\mathbf{\epsilon 3.30}$ (2023)

Cafeterias and RU are generally open from Mondays to Fridays, in the morning, at noon and in the evening (depending on the ${\tt RU}$).

IZLY - Campus payment service



As a student at ISBA, you can activate an IZLY account to pay for your meals at the RU.

After you've met ISBA's Education team, you will receive an e-mail with a link to access your account.

TIP: You can download the IZLY app for a better experience

To fund your account, click on "recharger" (reload) on the homepage and select the amount you wish to transfer on your IZLY account.

To pay with IZLY, open the app, click on "payer" (pay). It will generate a QR code that you can have scanned by the RU's cash person.

BDE (STUDENT OFFICE) - BY AND FOR STUDENTS

BDE is in charge of promoting and livening up student life at ISBA.

The team is composed of volunteers that organize themed parties throughout the year, help students get access to and discounts on project supplies and develop new partnerships to get good deals (vegetables baskets, etc.)

This **student support group** can help you get in touch with other students from Besançon. Most posts are related to...


- places: finding or leaving your apartment

UNI'S HEALTH & MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

The university has a preventative medicine department composed of practitioners, nurses, a nutritionist, a psychologist and a social worker.

They offer free vaccination updates, individual medical and social information, and consultations on dietetics, contraception, prevention of STIs and disability.

A psychologist can be consulted by appointment and in complete discretion.

They also organise prevention initiatives on a range of subjects (tobacco, alcohol, AIDS, etc.) and provides first-aid training.

PRACTICING YOUR RELIGION

Context in France:

France is a **secular state**, which means our republic separates the state from religion. Therefore, there is **no state religion** and it is **neutral** towards religious and spiritual beliefs.

The republic ensures that the principle of secularism is followed by higher education institutions, which means you won't find any room dedicated to religious practices in a public school in France for instance.

Main places of worship in Besançon:

- Catholic worship: "La source" youth meetings at the student chaplaincy, 9 rue de la Convention
- Catholic Orthodox Church of France, 1 rue Grand-Charmont
- **Protestant worship:** Reformed church of France, 5 rue Goudimel
- Jewish Faith: Synagogue, 23C quai de Strasbourg
- Muslim worship: Mosque, 7 rue Elisée Reclus
